on a Thursday after school. Our school netball team also meet and practice on a Thursday at the Bettridge Centre.


The school has several football teams and I can take this opportunity to thank all the parents involved in coaching and running the school teams.

### ALEC


The **ALEC** (Aberdeenshire Life Education Centres) mobile classroom will be visiting Newtonhill on the 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of September.

**ALEC** is part of **Coram Life Education**, a charity providing a

unique health education programme which teaches children about the wonder of their bodies, how to take care of themselves and how drugs can affect them. In addition to this, a new programme called bCyberwise has been added this year. bCyberwise is a programme aimed at middle to upper primary pupils. It is designed to allow children to learn how to be respectful and safe online and to promote positive cyber citizenship.

The 9 different programmes are age appropriate, matching the physical/emotional development of the children. The specially equipped classroom provides an unforgettable experience for the children and will complement our school's health and wellbeing programme. Please find the ALEC timetable attached

### The 'Excellence' Factor

This session we will continue to celebrate pupils' achievements across the curriculum with our 'excellence factor' awards at assembly. Every week teachers will choose at least one pupil from their class who has worked particularly well in a curriculum area, displayed an excellent approach towards their work or demonstrated excellence in their behaviour, attitude or ethos.

They will be recognised at assembly, presented with a Head Teacher award and their photo will be displayed on our TV screen at the school entrance.

## Behaviour and Golden Rules.

At the start of each term we remind the children of our 'Golden Rules' and the high expectations we have regarding behaviour. All class teachers have a similar reward and sanction system in class. We do have high expectations of all our pupils regarding behaviour. This year staff will be developing a restorative practice approach to dealing with behaviour. I am delighted to say that the start of this session has been very good and all pupils are trying very hard in class and in the playground. On the very rare occasion where a pupil has to be sent to the head teacher it will be recorded and parents will be contacted after two such incidents.



## Aberdeenshire Volunteering Awards

We have now participated in the Aberdeenshire Volunteering Awards for a number of years. This session we are also including Primary 3 pupils. It is voluntary and the pupils can volunteer to help in and around school and the community in order to build up their hours and receive their awards. It is made clear to the pupils what constitutes as volunteering activities and jobs. It

really is a valuable activity for the pupils in becoming responsible citizens.

## European day of Languages

This year the European Day of Languages is September 26<sup>th</sup>. Our Visiting Specialist French teacher, Miss Ruxton, will be working with senior pupils to deliver an assembly on September 24<sup>th</sup> with the whole school participating in modern languages activities.



## Abernethy 2016

Our Primary 7 pupils have already had information given to them regarding the residential trip to Abernethy. This is a very popular trip and a traditional part of the Primary 7 year. An information evening for parents will be organised for later this session.

## School Improvement Plans

Our school improvement plans this session focus on improving and developing the curriculum for all learners. We will also be developing Restorative Practice and 1+2 Modern Languages across all year groups. These will be available for all parents to view.

## Friends of Newtonhill (F.O.N.)



## Car Park

Please can I remind all parents that the bus lane is for the school buses and taxis. Please do not use this lane to park or drop off your children. The drop off lane is not a parking lane. It is for all parents to use and access as a drop off zone and this becomes very difficult when some parents choose to park there.

It is important that all staff can park in the morning and some days we are busier than others with visiting staff. The car park is for staff and, in line with Aberdeenshire guidelines, we operate a reverse car parking policy.

We appreciate your cooperation and recognise how difficult parking is in the vicinity of the school but please park with consideration to those who live within the local area.

Pupils have also been reminded to use the paths into school and not to run down the embankment into the car park and the back of parked cars.
