<b>Cold Weather</b>	Sunny Days	Rain, rain, rain	Anytime
<ul> <li>1: FREEZE SOME BUBBLES!</li> <li>If it's freezing outside, bubbles will freeze! Any bubbles you blow which land on a frozen surface should start to freeze. You'll see beautiful patterns start to appear as the bubbles freeze.</li> <li>2: ICE DECORATIONS!</li> <li>Make frozen sun catchers and tree decorations by arranging berries, leaves, feathers etc in a plastic lid or shallow container. Cover with water and leave (overnight) to freeze. If you add a piece of string you'll be able to hang it up!</li> <li>3: PAINT THE SNOW!</li> <li>If you put a few drops of food colouring and some water in a spray or squeezy bottle you can paint the snow!</li> <li>4: HOWL AT THE MOON!</li> <li>When it's cold and dark outside, that's the best time to see the stars and listen for creatures at night. Join in and have a proper, as loud as you can howl at the moon!</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>1: STICK DREAM CATCHERS!</li> <li>Either find a good y shaped stick or secure 3 or 4 together using rubber bands to make a triangle or square. Then simply wrap string, wool or ribbon around it to make a lattice. You can then add leaves, berries or flowers to make them even more beautiful!</li> <li>2: BUILD A DEN!</li> <li>You could make a mini den for fairies, insects or toys, or try to make a den big enough for you and your family!</li> <li>3: CLASSICS!</li> <li>Play hide and seek! Build an obstacle course!</li> <li>4: COOK OUTSIDE!</li> <li>You could make some warm mulled juice, find a recipe for stick bread or just have a chilly day BBQ! Why not?!</li> </ul>	<ol> <li>1: CATCH THE RAIN!         Think of ways to collect as much rain water as possible. What could you use? How could you improve on your design? If you didn't have taps or access to a river, this is how you'd have to collect your water         2: MAKE A WATERPROOF DEN!         Can you make a shelter in your garden that will keep you dry?         3: <u>GET MUDDY!</u>         A rainy day is the perfect time to get muddy (with permission!). Perhaps you can get some old pans, post, cutlery and jugs and make mud cakes, mud pies or a mud tower!         4: MAKE RAIN MUSIC!         Rain makes wonderful sounds all by itself.         However, can you get the rain to make different sounds? On pots, boxes, empty bottles etc. You might even be able to record the sounds!         5: SPLASH IN PUDDLES!         Get wellies and waterproofs on and go for a rainy-day adventure. Where are the best puddles near your house?     </li> </ol>	<ul> <li>1: <u>BIG BUBBLES!</u> As long as it's not too windy, you can make your own BIG bubbles using the recipe in the link.</li> <li>2: <u>MAKE A KITE!</u> It doesn't have to be windy when you make one, just when you want to fly it! <sup>(C)</sup></li> <li>3: <u>MAKE A CATAPULT!</u> There are so many different types you can try! Why not work togethe and see how far your catapult can send an object?!</li> <li>4: <u>WHAT ABOUT WHITTLING?</u> All you need is a tattie peeler and some sticks! There are lots of thing you could try, as long as you have a adult with you, as always!</li> <li>5: <u>ELDER BEADS!</u> Make your own necklace or garlant using some elder branches and string! You'll need loppers or gardening scissors to cut the wood</li> </ul>
