Dear Parents/Carers

Following our mid-term break I hope you and your families are well, and that you have managed to enjoy some family-time over the past week. We are already well into a busy third term at Newtonhill. You should have received your child's class newsletter detailing information specific to learning and routines in each class.

Nursery Inspection

Our school nursery recently had an unannounced inspection from the Care Inspectorate. We were delighted to receive very positive feedback from the Care Inspectorate in the areas of care, nurture, play, learning, our setting and staff team.

We received an adequate grade in the area of leadership where the focus for improvement was within quality assurance and planning.

The Care Inspectorate outlined the actions below and we are working hard to address these.

- a) regular, effective and focused monitoring is carried out across the setting.
- b) robust and effective quality assurances processes are implemented with involvement from the staff team.
- c) clear and effective plans are in place for maintaining and improving the service.
- d) robust evaluations and audits are developed and implemented, with any actions addressed promptly.

Weather/clothing

Whilst we are hoping for drier days and brighter evenings we still have to cope with the wet and muddy playing fields within the school. Please can you ensure your child has a change of clothes, especially underwear, socks and joggers or leggings just in case they have a fall.

Parking/Traffic Cones

This appears to be a standing item for every newsletter. We are very aware of the parking challenges in and around the school. Please do not park in the school car park. All the spaces are required as we have over 40 staff members at Newtonhill and often have visiting colleagues from health, social work etc. Whilst most teaching and nursery staff are here before 8am the pupil support team require the spaces nearer to 9am.

Do **Not Park** in the bus lane or behind the disabled parking zone. We have had to resort to marking this area with traffic cones and these have been hit by cars on several occasions.

We do encourage 'Park and Stride' and we kindly request that all families that drive to drop off and pick up pupils are considerate to the school neighbours. Thank you for your help, support and understanding with this matter.

Important Reminders

Please ensure that pets are not brought to the school playground or at any drop-off/pick-up locations around the school. We have recently had a number of dogs brought into the playground before and after school. Please keep dogs at home at this time or out with the school grounds.

All parents/carers please ensure that your child(ren) do not bring any of the following food items to school as they can present serious hazards to themselves and/or others:

- Lollipops with stick attached.
- Nuts of any kind (we have a growing number of children with nut allergies and any contact can have extremely serious consequences)
- Any form of Nutella products (as they contain nuts)
- Cereal bars Please be mindful if these are brought to school: as they can contain nuts (please check the nutrition information)
- Please ensure that no fizzy juice is given for packed lunch and please have water only in class water bottles. <u>PRIME</u> is not allowed as a drink in school.

Chewing gum is becoming an issue with senior pupils. Chewing gum is not allowed as a snack and must not be chewed in class.

In addition to the above can we kindly request that toys from home are not brought to school. These are often precious or valuable and we do not want any personal items to go missing or get broken. This includes soft toys, dolls, i-pads etc.

We kindly request that pupils do not wear dangling earrings. These are a safety hazard. Small earrings may be worn but must be removed or taped for P.E.

<u>Informal Curriculum Meetings – Coffee-Chat-Curriculum</u>

I would like to reinstate an informal get together for parents and myself with other staff if available. Prior to Covid we held Coffee-Chat-Curriculum sessions just to discuss and/or explain about current policy, developments or changes in education and how it is supported and delivered at Newtonhill.

In the past evening events have been poorly attended with only a handful of parents able to attend. The coffee mornings or afternoons allowed parents to pop in after dropping off or before picking up their child/ren. To see if there is interest in this I am proposing an initial 'chat' with coffee on the morning of **Friday 1**st **March** just after 9am until 9.45/10am and in Hall 2.

This first chat will be around additional needs, support and inclusion. All parents are welcome to attend but an indication of numbers would be greatly appreciated. Please can you complete this form **only** if you would like to attend.

FON Disco

Our next FON School Disco is Thursday 29th February. We kindly ask that each child brings a minimum donation of £2.00 with them on the evening as a donation for FON. The timings are:

6.15pm - 7.00pm Primary 1-3 7.15pm - 8.15pm Primary 4-7

Children in P1-3 should be brought to the disco by a parent/carer and should enter by the main school entrance. All P1-3 children must be collected by a parent/carer at the end of the disco. When collecting your P1-3 child please wait at the main door/entrance until you are let into the hall to collect your child. Please exit the school via the hall door closest to the kitchen and the P4/5 door into the playground. P1-3 children and parents are kindly requested not to leave via the main door as P4-7 will be arriving for the next disco. Having a one-way system on exit for P1-3 ensures safety for all.

Children in P4-7 should wait outside the main school entrance and will be allowed to enter the school once all the P1-3 children have been collected from their disco. P4-7 children must be collected by a parent/carer and will exit from the main school entrance.

Phones should not be brought to the disco.

We request that water bottles be brought for the discos - no fizzy juice or energy drinks are permitted.
